**Paul Olum Visiting Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics.**

Visiting appointment at 1.0 FTE (9-month appointment), beginning 9/16/10 and is renewable through 6/15/12.

**Essential Functions:** To teach 4 quarter courses per year and to carry on a program of research in mathematics, statistics, or mathematics education.

**Minimum Qualifications:** PhD in Mathematics, Statistics or closely related field, an outstanding record of research, and evidence of teaching ability.

Named after the well-known topologist and former University of Oregon President Paul Olum, the Paul Olum Research Assistant Professorship is a two-year postdoctoral position designed to help the careers of promising young mathematicians. The Department of Mathematics provides an excellent research environment with many fine mentoring opportunities.
