Tenure related appointment at 1.0 FTE (9-month appointment), beginning 9/16/08.

**Essential Functions:** To teach five (5) quarter courses per year and to carry on a program of research in mathematics, statistics, or mathematics education. Some departmental and university committee work will be expected.

**Minimum Qualifications:** PhD in Mathematics, Statistics or closely related field, an outstanding record of research, and evidence of teaching ability.

The Department of Mathematics of the University of Oregon is a Tier I research department with internationally recognized research groups in Algebra, Analysis, Topology, Geometry and Probability/Statistics. The Department has a strong and vibrant PhD program with about 50 students.
